from ? print names of those who have sent mail

**SYNOPSIS** 

from [-c] [-f file] [-s sender] [user]

## **DESCRIPTION**

The from utility prints out the mail header lines from the invoker's mailbox.

The following options are available:

-c Just print a count of messages and exit.

-f file

The supplied file is examined instead of the invoker's mailbox. If the -f option is used, the user argument should not be used. Read from standard in? put if file name ?-? is given.

-s sender

Only mail from addresses containing the supplied string are printed.

If user is given, the user's mailbox is examined instead of the invoker's own mail?

box. (Privileges are required.)

## **ENVIRONMENT**

MAIL If set, the location of the invoker's mailbox. Otherwise, the default in /var/mail is used.
