strfry - randomize a string

**SYNOPSIS**

```
#define _GNU_SOURCE        /* See feature_test_macros(7) */  
  
#include <string.h>  
  
char *strfry(char *string);
```

**DESCRIPTION**

The strfry() function randomizes the contents of string by randomly swapping characters in the string. The result is an anagram of string.

**RETURN VALUE**

The strfry() functions returns a pointer to the randomized string.
