



Windows PowerShell Get-Help on Cmdlet 'Remove-AzFirewallPolicy'

PS:\>Get-HELP Remove-AzFirewallPolicy -Full

```
Remove-AzFirewallPolicy -Name firewallpolicy -ResourceGroupName TestRg
```

This example removes the firewall policy named "firewallpolicy" in the resourcegroup "TestRg"

----- Example 2 -----

```
Remove-AzFirewallPolicy
```

-ResourceId
```

```
"/subscriptions/12345/resourceGroups/TestRg/providers/Microsoft.Network/firewallpolicies/firewallPolicy1"
```

This example removes the firewall policy by the Id.

----- Example 3 -----

```
Remove-AzFirewallPolicy -InputObject $fp
```

This example removes the firewall policy \$fp
