### ***PowerShell Get-Help on command 'Set-SystemPreferredUILanguage'***

***PS C:\Users\wahid> Get-Help Set-SystemPreferredUILanguage***

#### NAME

Set-SystemPreferredUILanguage

#### SYNOPSIS

Sets the provided language as the System Preferred UI Language.

#### SYNTAX

```
Set-SystemPreferredUILanguage [-Language] <String> [-PassThru]  
[<CommonParameters>]
```

#### DESCRIPTION

Sets the provided language as the System Preferred UI Language.

After a language is set as the System Preferred UI Language, you have to restart the device or login again for changes to take effect. Additional accounts created after setting the System Preferred UI Language will be configured to use the new language.

## PARAMETERS

-Language <String>

The bcp47 tag of the language to set as the System Preferred UI Language.

-PassThru [<SwitchParameter>]

If specified, this parameter returns the bcp47 tag of the language upon successful configuration of the System Preferred UI Language.

<CommonParameters>

This cmdlet supports the common parameters: Verbose, Debug, ErrorAction, ErrorVariable, WarningAction, WarningVariable, OutBuffer, PipelineVariable, and OutVariable. For more information, see about\_CommonParameters (<https://go.microsoft.com/fwlink/?LinkID=113216>).

Example 1: Set the System Preferred UI Language on a Windows installation

```
Set-SystemPreferredUILanguage ja-JP
```

This command sets the System Preferred UI Language to Japanese.
