Note realpath(1) is the preferred command to use for canonicalization functionality.

Print value of a symbolic link or canonical file name

- -f, --canonicalize
 - canonicalize by following every symlink in every component of the given name recursively; all but the last component must ex? ist
- -e, --canonicalize-existing

canonicalize by following every symlink in every component of the given name recursively, all components must exist

-m, --canonicalize-missing

canonicalize by following every symlink in every component of the given name recursively, without requirements on components existence

-n, --no-newline

do not output the trailing delimiter

-q, --quiet Page 1/2

```
-s, --silent
```

suppress most error messages (on by default)

-v, --verbose

report error messages

-z, --zero

end each output line with NUL, not newline

- --help display this help and exit
- --version

output version information and exit
