# **DESCRIPTION**

getgid() returns the real group ID of the calling process.

getegid() returns the effective group ID of the calling process.

#### **ERRORS**

These functions are always successful.

## **CONFORMING TO**

POSIX.1-2001, POSIX.1-2008, 4.3BSD.

## **NOTES**

The original Linux getgid() and getegid() system calls supported only

16-bit group IDs. Subsequently, Linux 2.4 added getgid32() and gete?

gid32(), supporting 32-bit IDs. The glibc getgid() and getegid() wrap? per functions transparently deal with the variations across kernel ver? sions.

On Alpha, instead of a pair of getgid() and getegid() system calls, a single getxgid() system call is provided, which returns a pair of real and effective GIDs. The glibc getgid() and getegid() wrapper functions transparently deal with this. See syscall(2) for details regarding register mapping.
