wcschr - search a wide character in a wide-character string

### **SYNOPSIS**

#include <wchar.h>

wchar\_t \*wcschr(const wchar\_t \*wcs, wchar\_t wc);

### **DESCRIPTION**

The wcschr() function is the wide-character equivalent of the strchr(3)

function. It searches the first occurrence of wc in the wide-character string pointed to by wcs.

# **RETURN VALUE**

The wcschr() function returns a pointer to the first occurrence of wc in the wide-character string pointed to by wcs, or NULL if wc does not occur in the string.
