NAME

from — print names of those who have sent mail

SYNOPSIS

$$\mathbf{from}\,[\,\mathbf{-c}\,]\,[\,\mathbf{-f}\,\,\mathit{file}\,]\,[\,\mathbf{-s}\,\,\mathit{sender}\,]\,[\mathit{user}\,]$$

DESCRIPTION

The **from** utility prints out the mail header lines from the invoker's mailbox.

The following options are available:

-c Just print a count of messages and exit.

-f file

The supplied file is examined instead of the invoker's mailbox. If the $-\mathbf{f}$ option is used, the user argument should not be used. Read from standard input if file name "-" is given.

-s sender

Only mail from addresses containing the supplied string are printed.

If *user* is given, the *user*'s mailbox is examined instead of the invoker's own mailbox. (Privileges are required.)

ENVIRONMENT

MAIL If set, the location of the invoker's mailbox. Otherwise, the default in /var/mail is used.

FILES

/var/mail/*
